| Round Oak support | £6,000 | Support from Round Oak school: SENCo given support to indentify and put into place intervention programmes, assessments of individual children. T and TAs given support which started to impact on the progress children make both academically and socially. |
| ECAC | £23,000 | The Every Child a Counter programme has supported Year 1 and 2 children with daily, 30 minutes, 1-1 early number lessons. The programme has had a great impact on the children's progress in maths. On average the average number age gain is 19 months in 1 term. |
| ECAR | £23,000 | The Every Child a Reader programme has supported Year 1 and 2 children with daily, 30 minutes, 1-1 early number lessons. The programme is having a great impact on the children's progress in reading; on average the children's reading age has increased by an average of 9 months progress in the first term. |
| 1:1 tuition | £10,000 | 40 children x 10 sessions at £25 per session. Impact to be evaluated at the end of the 10 sessions. |
| Counselling | £7000 | Barriers to learning removed, children more able to access the curriculum. All children made at least satisfactory progress with most children making good progress in at least one area. Feedback from children, parents and class teachers report a change in attitudes to learning and motivation. |
| Outstanding Teaching Intervention programme | £9000 | Due to start in Spring 2013. Impact to be measured from April 2013 therefore not included in total figure below. |
| Learning Mentor | £12,500 | Removing barriers to learning through support for social and emotional issues and improved attendance. |
