ECAC	£42,483	<p>The Every Child a Counter programme supports KS1 and KS2 children with daily, 30 minutes, 1-1 early number lessons.</p> <p>The programme is having a great impact on the children's progress in maths.</p> <p>8 children are currently undertaking the programme; impact to follow.</p> <p>Four children in KS1 completed the programme; the average number age increase was 17.25 months progress in 4 months.</p> <p>Four children in KS1 completed the programme in the Spring term; the average number age increase was 13.5 months in 3 months</p> <p>4 children are currently undertaking the programme in KS2: impact to follow.</p>
ECAR	£24,261	<p>The Every Child a Reader programme supports Year 1 and 2 children with daily, 30 minutes, 1-1 early number lessons. The programme is having a great impact on the children's progress in reading.</p> <p>10 children have completed or are currently undertaking the programme. The children who have completed the programme have made 14.5 months progress in their reading age during the 4 months of the programme. Pupils, parents and teachers have noticed a marked improvement in the childrens' attitude towards reading.</p>
1:1 tuition	£5,250	6 children; impact to follow at the end of Summer Term 2014.
Counselling	£4180	<p>Barriers to learning removed, children are more able to access the curriculum.</p> <p>Number of children= 14</p> <p>Feedback from children and parents indicate that the play therapy has had a major impact on the children generally as well as in their attitude to learning.</p>
Outstanding teaching	£9000	All teachers who undertook the training feel that their teaching has improved on a daily basis and that this is having an impact on the progress the children are making. Lesson observations to take place in the Summer Term 2014 to assess more formal impact.

Learning Mentor	£14,509	<p>Removing barriers to learning through support for social and emotional issues and improved attendance.</p> <p>Number of children= 33</p> <p>Barriers to learning have been removed.</p> <p>Feedback from children and parents and staff indicate that the sessions have had a major impact on the children generally as well as in their attitude to learning.</p> <p>The Learning Mentor is also able to pick up issues early which can then be referred to the counsellor.</p>
