January 2018 – Spring Review



For the academic Year September 2018 to August 2019 Lillington Nursery and Primary School will receive £18,730 PE and Sport Premium Funding as well as £2,546 carried forward from 2017-18. We must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport on offer to pupils.

This means we will use the premium to:

1. To develop or add to the PE already in place in school (referring to the aims below)
2. To make improvements now for future pupils

The 5 key indicators where improvements should be seen are:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The National Curriculum aims for Physical Education include for all children:

- To be physically active, working towards a target of 30 minutes activity during and after the school day (excluding general play times)
- To excel in a broad range of activities
- To engage in competition
- To lead healthy lifestyles

Lillington Nursery and Primary School aim to do meet the curriculum expectations with the help of the Sport Premium Funding by providing:

- A more inclusive curriculum
- A growth in traditional and alternative sports
- Improvements in our partnership work with other schools
- Creating links with other subjects that contribute to greater social, spiritual, moral and cultural skills for our pupils
